Higher Intermediate	K6 Students with a command of basic sentence structure, vocabulary and kanji	To acquire the ability to express oneself in and understand Japanese at a basic level in both oral and written contexts. This level seeks to develop basic language skills as a foundation for learning the specialist language used in specialized academic disciplines.	Sentence structure: intermediate Vocabulary: 5,000 words Kanji: 800 characters
Advanced	K7 Students with an adequate command of common expressions in oral and written Japanese	To acquire the ability to understand university lectures, read text and reference books, write papers and take examinations.	Sentence structure: advanced Vocabulary: 7,000 words Kanji: 1,000 characters
