## BISC国際交流オンライン・プログラム



# Program A: Intercultural Student Media Project

学生同士で行うインタビューを通じて異文化コミュニケーション力の向上を目指し、 相互理解を深め、グローバルな視点を持ちながら、コンテンツを制作するプログラムです。 2020年のテーマは、「コロナ禍と学習」。

A joint group project between students at the BISC and Keio University to create series of media contents (video, podcast or blog) to record how coronavirus has affected student learning.

Topics will explore the impact of the virus on learning, and may seek to investigate questions such as:

What issues do they face? What tools do they use?

- Participants will be paired (from each university) and will work together during the Fall term to conduct series of interviews with each other.
- In the Winter term, students will select an appropriate medium (podcast, blog post or video) and produce a resource suitable for a general audience.







# Program A: Intercultural Student Media Project

**Commitment:** 1 hour per week (Thursdays at 8-9pm Japan time, during the term)

**Dates:** 5th November 2020 – 25th February 2021

Communication method: via Zoom

### **Learning outcomes**

- Develop project management skills through identifying resources, planning and delivering the project on time.
- Demonstrate effective oral and written communication in English, through interviews, reflections and meetings
- Develop creativity and self-production skills in an international context
- Apply intercultural awareness skills through working as part of an international team
- Create an intercultural resource.

This project is part of the BISC Skills Award (BSA), a programme designed to help students achieve various skills through co-curricular activities in academic research, self-development, global citizenship and career development.





# Program B: Intercultural Student Conference Grant Bid

国際的なイベント企画に於ける様々な課題についてディスカッションを行い、 模擬国際カンファレンスをデザインするプログラムです。異文化コミュニケーション、 企画、助成金申請のスキルアップを目指します。

A joint group project between the BISC and Keio University. Participants will develop a grant proposal to take part in a model conference in Japan (designed by BISC students), on international students in higher education.

Students in Japan will also act as advisors for BISC students to provide advice on topics, location, budget and guest speakers. Participants will have the opportunity to present their project at the BISC Festival of Ideas (an international student conference).







# Program B: Intercultural Student Conference Grant Bid

**Commitment:** 1 hour per week (Wednesdays at 8-9pm Japan time, during the term)

Date: 4<sup>th</sup> November 2020 – 24<sup>th</sup> February 2021

Communication method: via Zoom

### **Learning outcomes**

- Develop project management skills through identifying resources, planning and delivering the project on time.
- Demonstrate effective English oral and written communication through interviews, reflections and meetings
- Apply intercultural awareness skills through working as part of an international team
- Learn how to write grant applications effectively in English

This project is part of the Intercultural Competency course at the BISC, taught by Dr Isabelle Brent. The exchange with students in Japan will be assisted by Midori Komachi.

### **Part 2: Interview**

All applicants will be contacted to arrange a short online interview in English, during the week of 19<sup>th</sup>-23<sup>rd</sup> October. This will consist of some basic questions to introduce yourself.

### Selection

Depending on the number of applicants, a competitive selection may be necessary. This may be carried out based on the applicant's communication ability at the interview.

All applicants will be contacted to confirm their place by 30<sup>th</sup> October 2020.
